Basic Grammar and Sentence Structure

- **Complete Sentences:** Understanding and writing complete sentences (subject and predicate).
- **Punctuation:** Using periods, question marks, exclamation points correctly.
- **Capitalization:** Using capital letters for proper nouns, the beginning of sentences, and titles.
- **Parts of Speech:** Identifying and using nouns, verbs, and adjectives in sentences.
